



ARTIST'S STATEMENT

This collection of drawings builds upon the *Flight Studies*. The works are larger and depict whole birds in flight. They are all derived from life drawings made in sketch books—and from many hours spent watching black headed seagulls in flight over Slaughden on the Suffolk coast.

In *Flight Drawing I*, I have imagined being above a seagull as it flies high over the shoreline at Slaughden. The Martello Tower, a famous local landmark, can be glimpsed far below. Lines of graphite hint at the lie of the land and the wandering surf, as it ebbs and flows between wooden groynes that extend outwards from a sea wall into the North Sea.

All the subsequent drawings imagine seagulls in various postures or held positions, as they wheel, arch, rise and dive through the air. In making them, I often try to capture a sense of what it might be like for the birds, whose form is such that the air can enfold them and allow them to veer, slice and tumble this way and that without risk of falling. They also provide a pathway towards larger finished drawings of seagulls in flight from *The Slaughden Project's Collection No 3 : Airborne.* These larger works focus on the imagined sense of being fully aloft over Slaughden; detached from the land and wandering in the sky, our atmosphere. I often draw blind to help this process.

By not looking at the paper as I draw, I try to instead imagine what flight must feel like for the seagulls; and I then let the marks follow on from this thought. I sometimes check the drawings to see how they look, but by drawing blind, my hope is that the lines of graphite may give to the viewer a visual impression of what it might feel like to be truly airborne, finding freedom in flight.
